

Format of Citation in Body of Paper

Parenthetical Citation Style

First Cite:

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The impact of chronic disease is known to affect both children and their parents (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention [CDC], 2013).

Subsequent Cites:

There were similarities and differences between interviews of children and their parents (CDC, 2013).

In-Text Citation Style

First Cite:

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC, 2009) studied the impact of chronic illness on children and their parents.

Subsequent Cites:

CDC (2009) reported similarities and differences between interviews of children and their parents.
